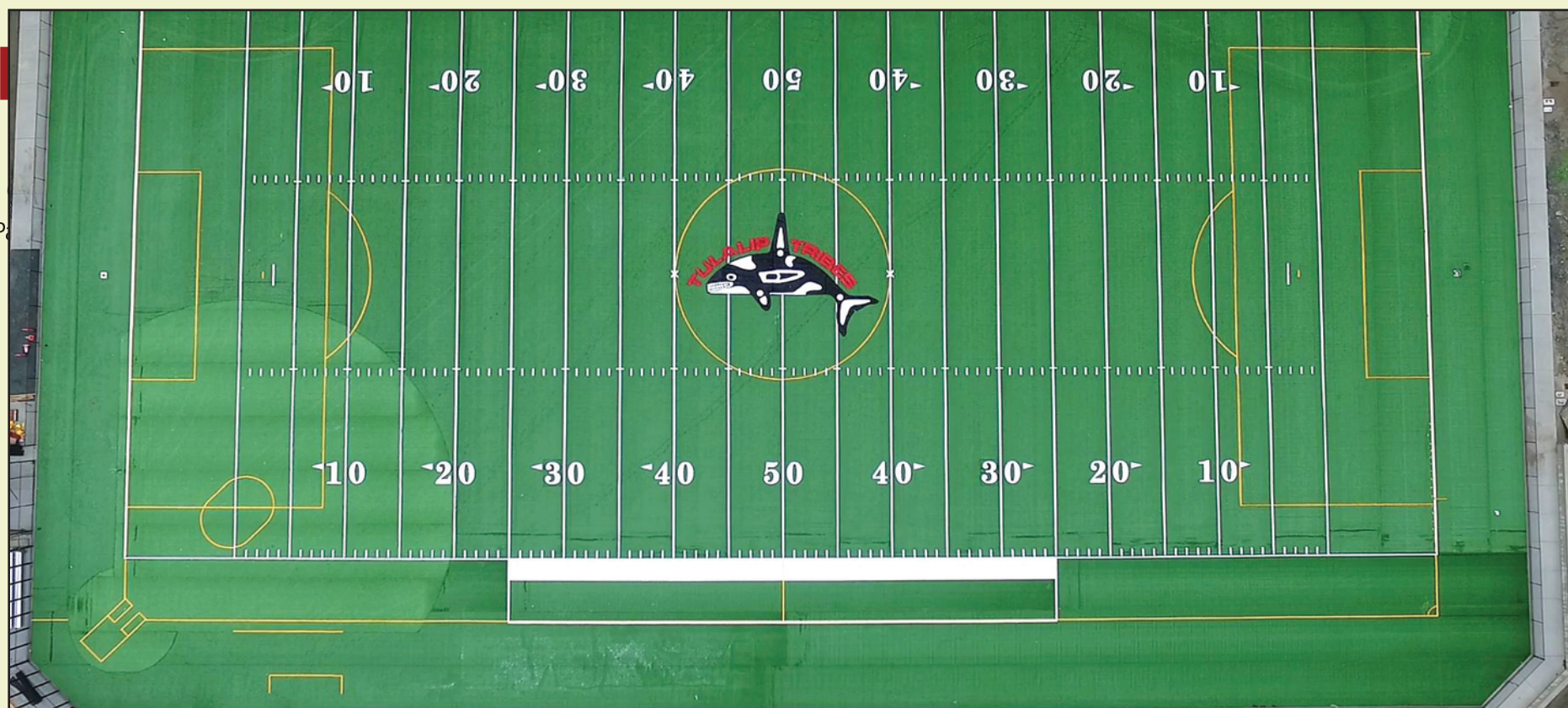

The flu viruses have arrived in Tulalip but it's not too late to vaccinate – Get your flu vaccine today!

This week at the Tulalip Health Clinic we diagnosed and treated three children with the flu under the age of seven. Unfortunately it is our children, elders (over the age of 50), and our pregnant women who are at high risk of having flu related complications (like severe illness, hospitalization, and even death). The flu season could stretch all the way into May this year so it is not too late to vaccinate!

For millions of people every season, the flu can mean a fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, fatigue, and miserable days spent in bed. However, you may not realize that each flu season, flu also causes hundreds of thousands of hospitalizations, and thousands or sometimes tens of thousands of deaths.

How do I know if I have the flu?

If you have a fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, or fatigue you might have the flu.

What can I do?

Prevent the flu by getting your flu vaccination, covering your cough, and regularly washing your hands (for 30 seconds or more).

When you are sick, wash your hands, cover your cough, stay away from loved ones, and go to the doctor quickly to be checked for the flu.

Studies show that flu vaccination can reduce flu illnesses, doctors' visits, missed work and school due to flu, as well as prevent flu-related hospitalizations. This is why CDC recommends an annual flu vaccine for everyone 6 months and older (including pregnant women). Flu vaccines are available at the Tulalip Health Clinic as a shot and as a nasal spray through a walk-in nurse visit for vaccination.

DO NOT LEAVE WITH ANY OTHER STAFF.

Eligibility: No person shall be a candidate for the Board of Directors unless he/she shall be an enrolled member of the Tulalip Tribes and shall have resided upon the Tulalip Reservation for a continuous period of one (1) year prior to the election, and shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age. No person may be a candidate if he/she has been found guilty of any felony, or a misdemeanor involving controlled substance or dishonesty in any Indian, State, or Federal court within three (3) years prior to the election.

Requirements for the petition are as follows:

- Must bear original signature of the candidate
- Must be signed by not less than five (5) legal tribal voters
- Voters may sign one (1) petition

The list of qualified candidates will be posted in a public place and otherwise be made know to the tribal membership not less than two (2) weeks prior to the election date. The Tribal rules and regulations governing elections shall apply.

Ninth baby orca confirmed in Puget Sound

Whale researchers say they've documented another baby orca born in Puget Sound.

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) officials said on Facebook Tuesday their researchers documented the new calf Monday.

The Center for Whale Research, which keeps a census of the orcas for the federal government, also confirmed the new orca.

Officials say it's the ninth born since December 2014 to the endangered population of killer whales that spend time in Washington state inland waters.

NOAA officials also said on Monday they observed an orca pushing

around a different newborn calf that had died. They say it is estimated that at least 50 percent of orca babies do not reach their first birthday, so the event is not unusual.

"Hearing that she was pushing around this dead calf was heart-wrenching," said Michael Harris, Executive Director of Pacific Whale Watch Association. "It's almost as if she wanted so much to be a part of this baby boom, to become a mother like so many in her pod, that she simply couldn't bring herself to the bitter reality of losing her calf."

There are now 85 members of the endangered Southern Resident Community of orcas, with an 86th member, Lolita, currently residing in Miami Seaquarium.

Thank the Seattle Times for the story "NW Tribes Unite", stating that Tribes in Western Washington are all against the proposed coal shipping terminal at Cherry Point adjacent to the Lummi Indian Reservation.

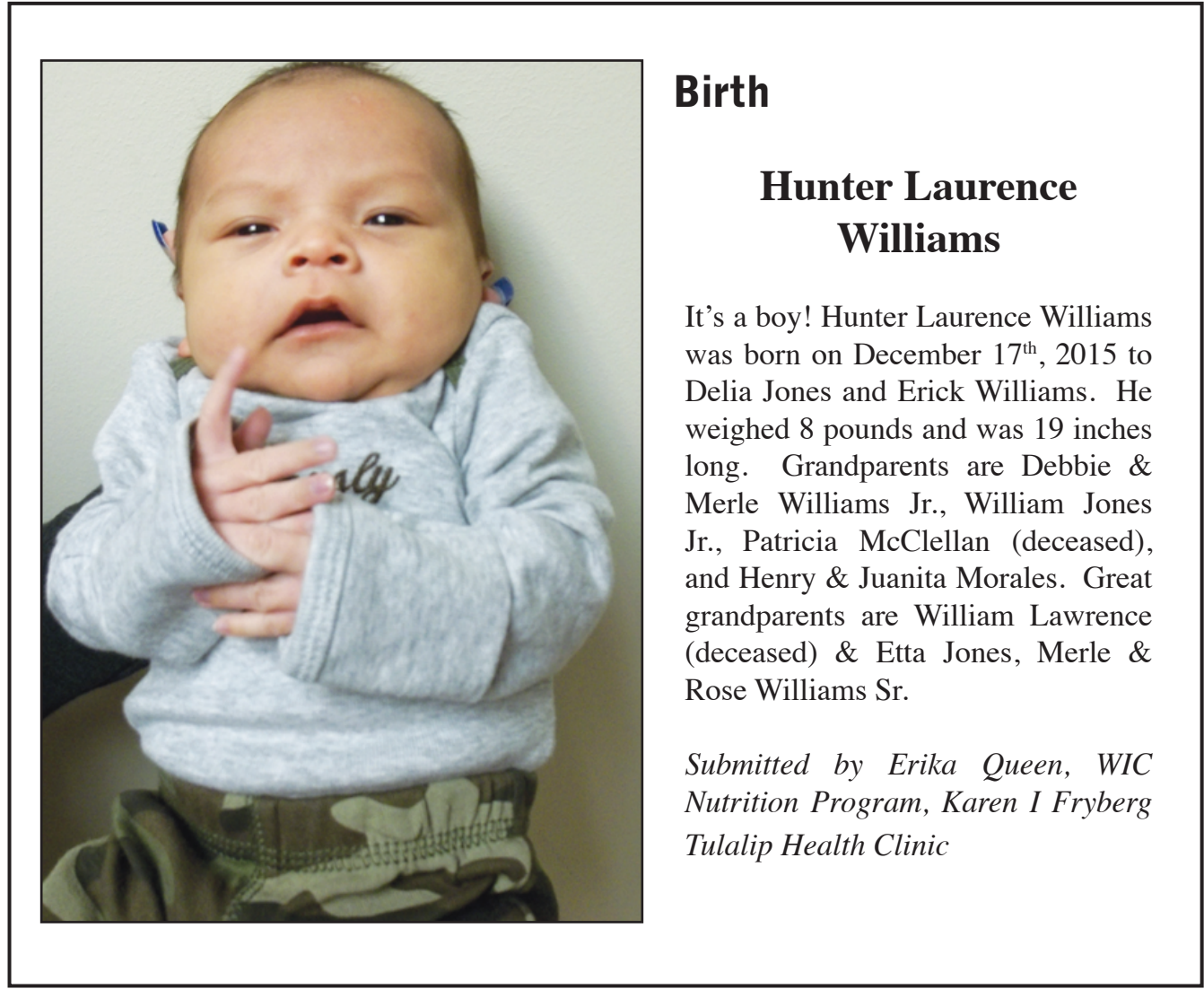
From the appearances it looks as though the Lummi Tribal Nation is the only Tribe in Washington State that are vigorously demonstrating to stop this terminal from becoming a reality. According to the article numerous Tribes are just "submitting letters" to the U.S. Corp. of Engineers opposing this action. The British Columbia Natives are also doing all they can and publicly demonstrating to protest this.

This is a very serious situation that could have a horrible impact on our tribal fishing, crabbing, clamming and natural resources rights that are guaranteed under the Treaties the United States entered into with the Tribes.

My hope is that all Tribes get together as a group and publicly "Demonstrate" to the Corp of Engineers with as many Natives attending as possible opposing the Coal shipping terminal. In my opinion a mere letter stating their objections is not enough!! Just look at the Oregon case currently going on, where a public demonstration is being made by ranchers about use of public lands. They have gained "national" attention to get their point across and their reason for the demonstration may not even be in the best interests for residents of Oregon as the news articles state they aren't even from Oregon.

I sincerely hope all the Tribes truly unite and follow the direction of the Lummi Nation by publicly showing their reasons for not having this project go forward.
